Little Dipper Park got an “F” on its report card in 2008 and Franklin Durr secured a \$5,000 challenge grant from the Anchorage Park Foundation to make repairs and upgrades. The State of Alaska backed a \$42,000 legislative grant. Franklin, his parents, Troop 215 and community volunteers reworked Little Dipper last summer. Parks and Beautification helped with planning, supervision and brought lunch for 60 volunteers. Franklin’s going to tell us about his project and how his Troop pitched in. Our part of town—from the Tudor-Muldoon curve to the swerve onto the Glenn Highway—is named after Anchorage pioneer homesteader Arnold L. Muldoon. He put up a log cabin among the spruce trees near Northern Lights Boulevard in the winter of 1940. He packed the materials out on his back, along a muddy trail that became Muldoon Road. Arnold L. Muldoon Park, named in his honor, preserves a portion of his original homestead. You may have noticed some of “Arnie’s Army” of volunteers planting flowers and working to Spruce Up Muldoon.
